SquashWise is at a special and unique time in our organization's journey. After a much longer and larger than anticipated capital campaign, our team can finally say that construction at the Greyhound building is underway! The historic and once-vacant bus terminal will soon be transformed into a 6-court, 3-classroom facility – a home for both our youth programs and increasingly the greater Baltimore community. Our youth development program for Baltimore City Public School middle and high school students will continue and, once in the new center, be able to double in size, and we will expand our current school and community squash offerings. This growth will be gradual, but we are so excited to put into action the plans we've been working on over the past three years. More information on our opening, anticipated for mid-2025, to come soon.

I encourage you to read through this Impact Report to learn more about our capital project and the accomplishments of our programs over the past year. As I think you'll see, SquashWise has evolved in the 17 years since our founding. Our afterschool youth development program is now joined by PE Clinics, Community Squash Nights, and Women's and Girls' Squash Clinics. This catalog of opportunities allows more youth and adults to engage with SquashWise and is a re-commitment to our mission to make the sport a more accessible and welcoming one for all. We have been thrilled with the response we've received so far and look forward to further enhancing this community squash model at the SquashWise Center.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT - SQUASH

As the only public school squash program in Baltimore, SquashWise has recreational, JV, and Varsity teams. They played in nearly 30 matches and tournaments last year alone! The travel tournaments are the highlight of the year for our students, as they look forward to experiencing new cities and meeting players from across the country. One of these tournaments, the Squash and Education Alliance's 2024 Team Nationals, is where SquashWise team captain, Marisa '26 shared her SquashWise story (bit.ly/ SquashWiseVideo).

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT – EDUCATION

SquashWise also layers academic skill-building, college and career planning, and mentoring to ensure that all of our students graduate from high school prepared for postsecondary life. Each year, 100% of our high school seniors graduate on-time. They pursue a variety of paths – college, vocational programs, military, and the workforce. Of the Class of 2024, 100% are attending two- or four-year schools.

GRADUATE SUCCESS

SquashWise alumni are doing big things, and we are here to partner with them on their college and career journeys! SquashWise offers 1:1 advising and a variety of scholarship programs to a growing number of alumni, ages 18-25, each year.

In addition to this support, alumni stay engaged with SquashWise through holiday and summer reunions as well as 'alumni connect' events where they share more about their college and career journeys with current middle and high school students. A SquashWise alumnus also sits on our Board of Directors, an opportunity to incorporate the alumni perspective in shaping our organization's exciting future.

85% of alumni have matriculated to two- or four-year colleges, as compared to 37% of graduates from Baltimore City Public Schools.

Of the 31 alumni who accessed support last year, 84% were attending two- or four-year schools, 3% were attending vocational programs, 3% were in the military, and 10% were working full-time.

During 2023-2024, SquashWise alumni graduated from Loyola University, Sheffield Institute, Dickinson College, Morehouse College, and the University of Maryland School of Social Work.

A first-year student at Morgan State University. What have you found to be most beneficial about the SquashWise program?

I find the Department of Graduate Success to be extremely helpful, especially as a college freshman. Having SquashWise staff on standby to talk about class schedules, getting your financial aid in order, setting up a resume, etc. has been so useful. I plan to reach out throughout the year so I can ensure my first year of college is a success.

WHAT WE DID



Since 2022, SquashWise has delivered a variety of new school and community squash programs. More than 400 youth from BCPSS have engaged with these programs over the past year, and we plan for participation numbers to grow upon moving to our permanent home.

- PE Clinics take place at Baltimore City Public Schools during the school day. Students try something new through various stations that teach them the basics of squash and support team-building.
- Community Squash Nights and Women's + Girls' Squash Clinics are accessible, fun, and free! All skill levels are welcome and equipment is available for anyone who needs it.

WHERE WE'RE GOING

Over the past year, SquashWise completed our capital campaign, raising \$15m to transform the historic Greyhound bus terminal into a youth and community squash center! Included in this total are contributions from our students, alumni, families, volunteers, and staff – all of whom will be recognized in the building alongside our other generous donors.

We also finalized the design for our 6-court, 3-classroom facility and started construction at the building. In April 2024, we celebrated this major milestone at our groundbreaking ceremony with students, families, donors, and elected officials including Comptroller Brooke Lierman and U.S. Congressman Kweisi Mfume.

Our capital project has been featured in the Baltimore Banner, Baltimore Fishbowl, Baltimore Heritage, Baltimore Sun, TODAY'S 101.9, WMAR, and WYPR. The SquashWise Center is anticipated to open in mid-2025. This new facility will allow us to double the size of our youth development program and expand our school and community squash programs to include field trips, youth and adult leagues, tournaments, and sliding-scale memberships.

We began recruiting members this past year as part of our Founding Members' Initiative. Through their commitments, this group of enthusiastic members are supporting our youth programs now and locking in their discounted gym membership for when the facility opens.
